TRIP OVERVIEW

This itinerary gives you the opportunity to visit some of the top birdwatching and wildlife viewing sites in Namibia, Botswana and Zimbabwe in the company of an Aves Africa guide

While this trip covers three different countries the majority of our time will be spent in Namibia, one of southern Africa's most popular and rewarding birding destinations. A land of remarkable biodiversity, breath-taking scenery and unique cultures, Namibia is also a land of stark contrasts. From the cold Atlantic Ocean and the inhospitable Namib Desert to the dry woodlands of the Namibian escarpment and on to the lush sub-tropical northern provinces bordering the Kavango and Kwando river systems, this is a magical birdwatching destination.

Birdwatching in Namibia is excellent with in the region of 685 bird species occurring of which 89 are endemic to the southern African region. Seven of the ten families endemic to the African mainland are represented with the bustard and lark families being particularly well represented. Although Namibia has a single endemic species in the Dune Lark it does boast 15 near endemic species including Gray's Lark, Rüppell's Korhaan and Herero Chat, White-tailed Shrike, Violet Wood-hoopoe, Rockrunner, Bare-cheeked Babbler, Rüppell's Parrot, Carp's Tit and Hartlaub's Francolin. Complementing these Namibian near endemics is the vast avifaunal diversity that is found in the north-eastern reaches of Namibia, as well as in the Chobe region of Botswana and Zimbabwe, making a visit to this region so attractive from a birdwatching perspective.

On top of the excellent birding, Namibia, as well as the northern reaches of Botswana and Zimbabwe, is home to some of the best game viewing areas in southern Africa including Etosha National Park, Bwabwata National Park and Chobe National Park. With its combination of superb scenery, accessible endemic birds and abundant game this is a destination which should be top of any birdwatcher's bucket list.



ITINERARY OUTLINE

On this 19 day Namibia, Botswana and Zimbabwe birdwatching trip we traverse a multitude of habitats starting out in the dry central and northern reaches of Namibia before heading eastwards to the sub-tropical riparian forests and rivers systems of north-eastern Namibia and Botswana before finishing the trip on the Zambezi River at the world famous Victoria Falls in Zimbabwe. While the focus will be on birdwatching there will be ample opportunity for mammal watching at several key sites included in the itinerary.

The tour starts in Windhoek. Namibia where we visit some local birding sites before heading southwards to the Namib Desert and world famous Sossuvlei. From there we descend down off the central plateau towards the coastal town of Walvis Bay where we will spend two days in search of waterbirds as well as some of the desert specials found in the adjacent Namib Desert including Benguela Long-billed Lark and Gray's Lark. From the coast we head inland, crossing the vast plains of Damaraland and on towards the majestic Spitzkoppe Inselberg where we search for Herero

Chat before heading on to the granitic Erongo Mountains. We spend the better part of two days in search of several Namibian specials including Hartlaub's Spurfowl, Rockrunner and White-tailed Shrike before traveling north to Etosha National Park, one of Africa's largest wilderness areas, where we spend three days birding as well as game viewing.

From Etosha we head north-eastwards, traveling along what was formerly know as the Caprivi strip, entering the core of the Kavango Zambezi Transfrontier Conservation Area. We spend three nights at Namushasha River Lodge, nestled on the banks of the Kwando River, exploring the mix of pans and wetlands and Combretum dominated woodlands. Bird diversity in this region is exceptional with a number of the Okavango specials occurring.

From Namushasha we cross the border into Botswana and spend two nights in the vicinity of Chobe National Park before finishing the trip at the mighty Victoria Falls in Zimbabwe.
